Saint-Laurent, May 8th, 2017 – The Musée des maîtres et artisans du Québec (MMAQ) is proud to present this project developed as part of the official programming for the celebrations of the 375th: *Saint-Laurent in 7 beats*, an virtual reality experience.

Come immerse yourself in a 360° video experience while local children present 7 short stories based on the Borough's history. Don't miss this new and original, technological and poetic creation for all ages. Starting May 26th, all citizens are invited to discover it, free of charge, at the Museum.

Once Upon A Time...

The adventure begins with the Great Peace of Montreal, initiated by chief Kondiaronk, which leads to the establishment of the first settlers on the coast of the Saint-Laurent. From the 1700s to the 2000s, we'll tackle the subjects of agriculture, education, cultural radiance, transportation, industrialization and more...

Educational and Participative Project

The participation of the schools of Saint-Laurent was made possible by collaboration with the Marguerite-Bourgeoys school board. In total, 9 classes from 3 primary schools and 2 classes from the local high school worked on the project.

Virtual Reality

For the virtual reality presentation, MMAQ paired up with the Beam Me Up society, a company specialized in augmented and virtual reality.
